The **RSV vaccine** helps protect against infection with RSV, a common virus that can make babies and older adults seriously ill.

It's offered on the NHS if you're pregnant, aged 75 to 79, or turned 80 after 1 September 2024.

If you are pregnant you should be offered the RSV vaccine around the time of your **28 week** antenatal appointment.

If you are aged 75—79(or turned 80 after 1st September 2024) contact your GP surgery to book your RSV vaccination.

Autumn Vaccinations—What to look out for...

Flu vaccine side-effects

Flu vaccines are very safe. All adult flu vaccines are given by injection into the muscle of the upper arm.

Most side effects are mild and only last for a day or so, such as:

- slightly raised temperature
- muscle aches
- sore arm where the needle went in this is more likely to happen with the vaccine for people aged 65 and over

Try these tips to help reduce the discomfort:

- continue to move your arm regularly
- take a painkiller, such as <u>paracetamol</u> or <u>ibuprofen</u> some people, including those who are pregnant, should not take ibuprofen unless a doctor recommends it.

Covid vaccine side-effects

Like all medicines, the COVID-19 vaccines can cause side effects, but not everyone gets them.

Most side effects are mild and should not last longer than a week, such as:

- a sore arm from the injection
- feeling tired
- a headache
- feeling achy
- feeling or being sick

You may also get a high temperature or feel hot or shivery 1 or 2 days after your vaccination. You can take painkillers such as <u>paracetamol</u> if you need to. If your symptoms get worse or you're worried, call 111.

The aim is to continue to improve the **quality of care** that we provide in alignment with the **need of our patient population.**

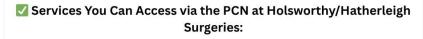

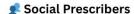

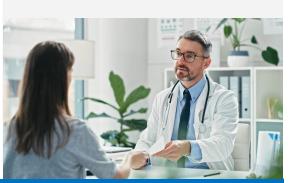

From 1 September 2025:

- pregnant womenall children aged 2 or 3 years
- on 31 August 2025

 Children with certain long-term health conditions (aged 6 months to less than 18 years)

 • primary school aged children
- (from reception to Year 6)
- secondary school aged children (from Year 7 to Year 11)
- all children in clinical risk groups aged from 6 months to under 18 years
- everyone aged 65 years and over
- individuals aged 18 to under 65 with certain long-term health conditions
- care home residents
- · carers in receipt of carer's allowance, or those who are the main carer of an elderly or disabled person
- · those living with people who are immunocompromised
- · frontline health and social care workers

The Pharmacy First scheme

Under Pharmacy First the following conditions can now be treated by your local pharmacist, without needing to see a GP.

- Sinusitis (for patients aged 12 years and over only)
- Sore throat (aged 5+)
- Earache (aged 1 year-17)
- Infected insect bite (aged 1 year+)
- Impetigo (aged 18 years+)
- Shingles (aged 18 years+)
- Uncomplicated urinary tract infections (women aged 16 to 64)



You can get shingles more than once, so it's important to get vaccinated even if you've had shingles before.

From September 2025, the NHS is expanding the shingles vaccination programme. Adults aged 18+ who have a weakened immune system are now eligible for the shingles vac-

Shingles is a common condition that causes a painful rash. It can sometimes lead to serious problems such as long-lasting pain, hearing loss or blindness.

You're more likely to get shingles, and it's more likely to cause serious problems, as you get older or if you have a severely weakened immune system.

Eligibility:

- People who turn 65 on or after 1st September 2023
- People aged 70—79
- People aged 18 and over with a severely
